

"HOBBY" ANDERSON died tragically on Thursday, April 6, 1972, in San Diego, California, when a motorcycle he was riding was involved in an accident.

Hobby was born in Wilson, N.C., on Aug. 25, 1938, the son of H. W. Anderson and the former Frances Herring. He prepared for Princeton at Episcopal High School, where he was active in athletics, the Choir, and Glee Club. He continued his interest in music at Princeton, joining the Glee Club his freshman year, and developed a natural talent for writing and literature by majoring in English and submitting a thesis on Thomas Hardy. During his senior year, he roomed with Bob Blalock and Larry Davis in Foulke Towers.

Following Princeton, Hobby attended Duke Law School with Gilbert Johnson and Larry Davis. During that year, he courted Molly Lipke of Grand Rapids, Mich., who was obtaining her master's degree at Chapel Hill, and later that year, married her and left the study of law for journalism.

Hobby's tragic death leaves unresolved his search for fulfillment and happiness, but it cannot dull our memory of his unselfishness, his wit, his facility for language, and his concern for others. At Princeton, he spent many hours recording books for the blind, but rarely mentioned this to his roommates or classmates. At Quadrangle Club, he enjoyed the fellowship of his friends and was an excellent companion for bridge, supper, and conversation. Perhaps his greatest legacy was the number of friends who cherish his memory and recall him as a "close" companion in college.

To Hobby's wife, Molly, and to his parents, the Class extends its deepest sympathy.
