PAUL DIED of a heart attack at home on Feb. 7. Born and raised in Riverdale, New York, he came to Princeton after graduating from Horace Mann School. Among his cher-

ished memories was playing a leading character, Chris Keller, in Princeton's production of Arthur Miller's All

My Sons in his senior year.

Paul was married in his first year at NYU Medical School, and by the time he earned his M.D. degree in June 1964 he was a seasoned father of three. He completed two years of medical training at the New York State University Medical Center in Syracuse before serving in the U.S. Army Medical Corps as a captain, stationed in Fort Belvoir, VA, and Fort Polk, LA, from 1966 to 1968. He returned to his medical alma mater, NYU, in 1971 to complete his training and fellowship in cardiology.

In July 1971, with the progeny count up to four, Paul and his family moved to Rumson, NJ. He was attending cardiologist at Monmouth Medical Center, Long Branch, where he became chief of the cardiology section. He served

in this capacity until his death.

Paul had a singular joie de vivre. It was abundantly expressed in the love of his family and committment to his patients. His energy overflowed in conversation, through an endless flow of playful puns and arcane references, and on the tennis court, a game which he played with verve and grace.

He is survived by his wife, Beatriz; his children, John, Paula, Matthew, Gabriel, and Anne; his parents, Dr. and Mrs. Nathan Block; and his sister, Dana Rosmarin. To them we extend our deepest sympathy and share their
