TED CROSBY's four-month struggle with cancer ended Christmas night in Jacksonville, FL, where he had lived most of his life.

Ted was a popular and prominent member of the Jacksonville community. He was a graduate of the Bolles School, which he later served as trustee and head of the Alumni Assn. His career was in the lumber business and he gave enthusiastically of his time to many organizations. He had been on the boards of the Rotary Club, the Speech and Hearing Centre, Memorial Hospital, American National Bank of Jacksonville, and the Florida Yacht Club. A founder of the Jacksonville Snow Ski Club, Ted and his family were avid skiers in the West.

At Princeton, Ted wrote his thesis on Walter Pater for the English Dept. and graduated cum laude. His cheerfulness and bright wit made a lasting impression on his many friends on campus and in Charter Club. He was active in the Princeton Club of North Florida and served a term as president.

It was a fitting tribute to Ted, when, on Dec. 27, it seemed as though all Jacksonville turned out at the Church of the Good Shepherd to honor his memory. Our deepest sympathy to his parents, his brother, James Ellis, and most especially to his devoted wife, Evelyn, and his children, Maria and Tod.
