

SIMON HENRY DEMUTH '60

SI DEMUTH died of cancer in Cleveland on Sept. 16, 1965. At the time of his death, he was a resident in internal medicine at University Hospital in Cleveland.

Si was born in New York and attended Clarks-town High School where he participated in wrestling, tennis, drama, student publications and the National Honor Society. At Princeton, he majored in the Special Program in the Humanities, winning the German Department's Prize in his junior year. In addition to his academic successes, Si also found time to play in the Princeton Orchestra and Band and to keep up his interest in carpentry. Si made many friends at Princeton and, as his mother wrote the Class, "the happiest years of his life were the four he spent as an undergraduate at Princeton." After college, he attended and graduated from the College of Physicians and Surgeons at Columbia in 1964. With his enthusiasm and understanding, Si would have made a fine doctor.

To his wife Nan Denton, a younger brother, David, two sisters, Vivienne Jr. and Shelley, and to his mother Mrs. Vivienne Blake DeMuth, the Class of 1960 extends its heartfelt sympathy.
