

JOHN RANDOLPH FETTER '60

JOHN RANDOLPH FETTER died suddenly on March 1, 1970, at his home in NYC. The cause of his untimely death was a heart attack. His widow, Pam, and close friend, Bill Stilley, have generously provided the following account.

John came to Princeton from Shady Side Academy in Pittsburgh where he had been active in athletics and the Pittsburgh Opera—an early indication of his varied talents. At Princeton, he was a member of Tiger Inn and majored in the Dept. of Sociology. Following graduation, John served in the U.S. Army, then obtained his masters degree in sociology at Rutgers. After returning to Pittsburgh as a market research analyst with The American Institute for Research, John met Pamela Pach, an alumna of Chatham College. They were married in Pittsburgh on May 23, 1968. At the time of his death, John and Pam lived in NYC where he was employed at the First National City Bank.

John enjoyed Princeton immensely and returned frequently. The Class and his friends have lost a devoted and warm friend, whose humorous approach to things was but one indication of his interest in others and enjoyment of living. John is survived by his widow, Pam, his mother, Mrs. Charles N. Higgins, and his brother William. To them the Class extends its sincere sympathy.
