

## ROBERT LEE MENDENHALL '60

ROBERT MENDENHALL was killed on June 3, 1972, when a Navy plane he was piloting crashed over Morocco. Bob entered Princeton in 1956, and left at the end of his sophomore year to enter Navy flight training, receiving his pilot's wings in July, 1960. In 1959, he married Roberta Lonsdale, who survives him.

Bob came to Princeton from Manasquan High School in Wall Township, N.J., and received a Bachelor's degree from the U.S. Navy Post Graduate School in 1966. In the years following his flight training the Mendenhalls were stationed in Patuxent, Md.; Argentia, Newfoundland; Jacksonville, Fla.; Norfolk, Va.; Monterey, Calif.; Corpus Christi, Texas; Virginia Beach, Va.; and Brunswick, Maine. From these air stations Bob flew to points all over the world. He was on a mission off Morocco at the time of the accident that claimed his life.

In addition to his widow, Roberta, Bob is survived by a son, Michael, and two daughters, Larie and Melody, his father, Carlos Mendenhall, a brother, Lt. Cmdr. Carlos Mendenhall Jr., and two sisters, Mrs. Kinda Greeley and Miss Maryann Mendenhall. To these members of his family, the Class extends its heartfelt sympathy.
