

CHARLES HENRY MELLON '60

IT WAS with great sadness that the class learned that Charlie Mellon was killed at dusk on Friday, Nov. 19, when he was struck by a car while jogging near his home in Far Hills, N.J. He was born in NYC on April 24, 1938. At the time of his death, he had been executive assistant to the chairman of the N.J. Sports and Exposition Authority, and had previously been an officer of the Bankers Trust Co. of New York and deputy director of the N.J. Division of Motor Vehicles. He was married to the former Katharine Hopkins by whom he is survived, and had a son, Charles Jr., and three daughters, Katharine, Camilla, and Eliza.

Charlie was a "giving" person who was always interested in athletics. He prepared for Princeton at St. Paul's School in Concord, N.H., and following his SPEC major, studied at Columbia University. He was social chairman of Ivy Club and later served as president of the graduate board of Ivy. Charlie was also president of the board of trustees of the Far Hills Country Day School. Many of us had enjoyed seeing him in June at the 15th Reunion.

At St. Paul's, Charlie was active in football, hockey, and lacrosse. He was widely traveled, and spent many summers in Europe during his years at Princeton. His club memberships reflect his lifetime interest in sports and the out of doors: the Racquet and Tennis Club of New York, the Essex Hunt Club of Far Hills, and the Northeast Harbor Fleet, Mount Desert Island, Maine. But it is for his gentle manner and kind thoughtfulness that he will most likely be remembered; our class has lost a valued member. To his wife, his mother, and family, the Class extends its sincerest sympathy.
